I George Heatcher of South Carolina being of Perfect mind & Memory
but knowing the uncertainty of Life do make this my Last Will and
Testament hereby revoking all Other Wills by me heretofore made
Imprimis I give to my son Edward Heatcher a fourteenth part of
my Estate to be vested in my son George in Trust for him for his
Support and Maintenance Item the remainder of my Estate both
Real and Personal I give to be Equally Divided immediately after
my Decease Between my Wife Rachel Heatcher my son George my
Daughters Mary Raiford Judith Hannah and Elizabeth Heatcher and
that my wife my son George and my Daughter Mary be Impowered
to make such Division as Equal & Just as Possible my will is further
that if Either of my two Children Judith or Elizabeth die before they
come to the Age of Twenty one or marry that the Division assigned
to the one so Dying be Equally Divided Among the Surviving Coparceners

Lastly I constitute and Appoint my son George Hancock, and my wife and Daughter Mary Executors to this my Last Will and Testament Signed with my own hand & Sealed the Twenty second Day of December in the Year of Our Lord one Thousand seven hundred and Eighty
