Constitute & ordain that my last Will & Testament
in manner & form following Viz I give my soul
to God who gave me, I bequeath my body to the Earth
from whence it was taken to be decently buried after
my directions at the discretion of my Executors
hereafter mentioned And as to my worldly Goods -
that it has pleased Almighty God most graciously
to bestow on me I give & bequeath in the following
manner to wit, I leave the same to my

Wife Mary for and during her natural life & when
of her right of 30 Dollars in my estate one hundred
Dollars to be paid to her at the death of the said

Acres of land to be laid off on the south east side
of the trail (now line) and to include the Small
Plantation House (now a well) and also one negro
man named (Charles) & one feather Bed & furniture
I also two Cows & one Grey mare that is now in my
possession & a broken head of hogs & four head of sheep
One set of Dutch Ovens 12 Dozen Knives & Forks 1/2 Doz-
Plates two Dishs & one season And after the decease
of my 8th Wife my will & desire is that the above ment
Property be returned to my Estate to be equally divided
between my Legates hereafter named. As to the remainder
of my Estate both Real & Personal I give & bequeath unto
my Children to be equally divided between them
Viz Ann Melen Lucy Eubank Elizabeth Williamson

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Sarah Lillie Sumner Dale Elmer Sharp
Joseph Jackson John Jackson William Sharkey and
Whereas some of my children have received part of my
Estate my will is that they receive the same to my
Estate that I have equal shares in as my children's share. My
Will further is that my three grand children viz
Mary Nancy & Poling Evans do share one child's
part of my said Estate and I do constitute them
as one legatee in my Estate which I give & bequeath
to them & their heirs of their bodies lawfully begotten
also in like manner I give unto my children the
above mentioned legatees in my Estate their proportion
parts of the same to them & to the heirs of their bodies
Item I give unto my daughter Mary Evans one
shilling Sterling and I do give my son John

for obtaining probate thereof in due form giving security
Whereupon they together with Thomas Lagwood Esqr

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Oley & Powell Curley their securities entered into and
acknowledged their bond in the penalty of ten thousand
Dollars Conditioned as the law directs Liberty being ascribed
to John Jackson the other Exor named in said will
to join in the probate thereof & show cause thereon to
fit
