of all & singular the goods, chattels & credits of the said deceased were
granted him with the will annexed as giving security. Wherefore
he together with a & certain others his security & entered into and
acknowledged their bond in the penalty of one hundred Dollars con-
tained in the true & faithful administration of said deceased's
Estate.
