 I have disposed of my Estate which it has pleased god to bestow on me within this
 World in the following manner (Viz) I Give & Bequeath to my
 Brother Farley Hatcher my Plantation Lying in Bedford County on
 Stanton River with all the Land adjoining thereto it is supposed to
 contain 206 Acres, I Give & Bequeath to my Brother Farley Hatcher
 one mare saddle also the rest of my plantation that James Boyd is to pay
 I Give and bequeath to my Brother Edwards Hatcher my Tract of Land
 in Bedford County Joining the Land of Jeremiah Ferguson John Woody
 and his own. I Give my desire is that my Brother Farley Hatcher shall pay off
 all Lawfull Demands that may be against my Estate after my Decease.....
 I Give & Ordain constitute and appoint my beloved Brother Farley Hatcher
 my whole sole Executor of this my Last Will and Testament, I do Witness
 whereof the said Peuben Hatcher have to this my Last Will and Testament
 set my hand & seal this Nineteenth day of October One thousand & Eighty nine
 sealed signed and Delivered by the said Peuben Hatcher as and for his Last
 Will and Testament and no other in the Presence of
