Wife of Bedford County being in a low state of health but of sound and
disposing mind and memory do make this my last will & Testament
in form and manner following, that is to say, In the first place
that all my estate real and personal shall be subject to the
payment of my just Debts whether due by specialty or on
open account, Then I give and Devise unto my beloved Wife
Isabel during the term of her life my land and plantation in Bedford
County together with all my farming tools and utensils, also one
sorel house and one bed and furniture, Then I give and Devise
unto my son Helkiah his share and portion forever (after the
Death of my said Wife Isabelle) all the said land and
plantation and farming tools and utensils Then I give, devise
and bequeath unto my children Mary, Isaac, Margaret, Sally
and John and their respective heirs or assigns all the residue
of my Estate to be equally divided amongst them, Lastly I
Appoint my said Wife Isabelle and my said son Helkiah to be
executors and Executors of this my last will and Testament In
Witness Whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my
