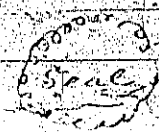

In the name of God Amen I Shewood Gadde of Bedford County being in perfect health and in sound mind and memory do make this my last will and Testament that is to say principally and first I give and recommend my soul into the hand of Almighty God and my body to Earth from whence it was taken to be buried in a Christian like manner at the discretion of my Executors that at the general resurrection I shall receive the same by the mighty power of God and as touching such worldly Estate whosoever it hath pleased God to bless me with in this life I give devise and bequeath in the following manner Nam I leave unto my loving Wife Mary Gadde during and to the end of the Year 1844 all the same as I now have and my Negroes Cattle Ben Cat & money & my Houses with my Bed & Chamber in my Bed house and kitchen furniture

also the whole of all the property I may die possessed with real and
personal all the Chattelion utensils all moneys on hand and
due or may hereafter become due during her life or widowhood
and at her decease to be divided as follows. It is my desire
that my Estate should be equally divided among my Children charging
each one with what they have had so as to make an equal division
it is my desire that my Son Joseph should take James as Valuation
that is to say what two good men should say he is worth at the time
he received him also my Daughter Hannah Burges should take
Ben on the same terms also Polly Gaddes Mary on the same
terms also Elizabeth Gaddes Martha on the same terms if it is
their wish to take them on those terms otherwise to be sold & the
money to be equally divided. I do constitute & appoint my
