Particularly I commend my Soul to God who have it and my Body
to the Grave to be decently Buried at the Discretion of my Executor
hereafter Named. I Give I Give to my ^{well} beloved Wife Ann Buford
a Third Part of all my Estate together with the Plantation whereon
I now live during life, I also leave my Landon River Dam Joining
David Halladays together with my three Young Horses to be Sold
and my Debts Collected to pay my Worlay Debts and all the
Rest of my Estate both Real and Personal to be Equally Divided
together with my Wifes thirds after her Decease Between my three
Children John, William and Nancy Provided my Wife be
not now with Child but if she should have a Live Child
within Nine months of this date it is to have an Equal Part
with the Rest of my Children and if any of my Children should
die before they come of Age not having an Heir of their Body their
Part of my Estate to fall Equally to the surviving Children

And do Appoint my Wife, Hele and Sole Executor of this my
last Will and Testament and Disanul all former Wills.

Augustine Hackworth and the Solemn Affirmation of John
Echols being one of the people called Quakers and Ordered to
be Recorded, And on the Motion of James Buford (Ann
Buford the Executrix in the said Will mentioned having first
Relinquished her Right of Administration to the said
James who made Oath thereto probate is Granted him in

215 due form giving Security, whereupon he together with Robert Cowan
William Callaway Junr. and John Eckols his Securities entered
into and Acknowledged their Bond in the Penalty of One
Thousand five Hundred Pounds for the Said Executors due and
faith full Administration of the Said Decedents Estate and
performance of his Will.
