1st It is my will that all my just debts be paid
2nd I give bequeath unto my daughter Nancy Trent the sum of five
Pounds which is all I leave her of my Estate Having already
given unto Obadiah A. Trent her husband a certain part
at her marriage But I leave in the hands of my
Executors whom I shall hereon appoint the sum of forty
Pounds for the benefit of my daughter Nancy Trent &
her children to be paid to them from time to time as the
Executors may think most advisable for the relief of their necessity

3rd The Balance of my Estate Real & Personal I do hereby give &
bequeath unto my other three children Viz Susanna Elizabeth William
Moxley & James Moxley to be equally divided between them

4th I do hereby appoint my son James Moxley & Samuel
Manack my Executors In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my
hand this 1st of North Day of April 1801

I do hereby give & bequeath unto my other three Children viz Susanna Elizabeth William
Mozley & James Mozley to be equally divided between them

I do hereby appoint my son James Mozley & Samuel
Manweth my Executors - In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my
hand & seal this 27th Day of April one thousand seven hundred
& ninety eight
