In the name of God Amen I William Campbell of the County of Bedford
being sick and Weak (now Bedrid) but in perfect sense and Memory do make this my
Last Will and Testament that is to say principally and first of all I recommend my soul
to Almighty God and as for my Body I desire it may be Buried in a Decent manner
at the discretion of my Executors hereafter named and as to what worldly goods I have
pleased God to Bless me with in this life I now and dispose of them in the follow-
ing manner and Form to wit

I bequeath Campbell one Negro Woman named Winney also her Bed and furniture
Likewise one Bay Mare and a Suffehans Maintenance of my plantation and one
Room in this house her life time also one dish and four plates I then give and
Bequeath unto my Son Samuel Campbell Two hundred Acres off the Upper end of my
Tract of Land running with the Oxide Line joining to Bu. Ford & John Edwards
line and if my son Samuel Sells or his plantation I leave him the Grasp of the
Meadow for Three Year I also give my Mulletto man named Benjamin
Likewise his Feather Bed and all the Furniture thers belonging with

one Large Iron dish and four plates also the fourth part of the Stock of
 Cattle hogs and sheep also my Negro Boy named Joseph to him his Heirs and
 assigns for ever Item, I give and Bequeeth unto my son Thomas Campbell
 one Negro man named James also one Negro Boy named Charles also four
 hundred the price of the land sold in Prince Edward County To him his
 Heirs and assigns. Item I give and Bequeeth to my son William Campbell
 and John Campbell the Tract of Land whereon I now live lying on both
 sides of Goose Creek and Moses Run the Four hundred and Sixty Acres
 which is the remainder of my Tract when my son Samuels part is taken
 of to be Equally divided Between the said William and John both in Quantity
 and Quality as it shall seem Most Equul to my Executors I also leave to
 son William Campbell my negro Man named Jacob and Negro Girl
 named Nance also one Feather Bed and Furniture also the fourth part of
 the Stock of Cattle hogs and sheep also one Iron dish and four plates also
 my slave to him his Heirs and assigns Item I give and Bequeeth to my
 son John Campbell my Three Young Negroes namely Major Sam and Bet
 also one Feather Bed with the Furniture also the fourth part of my Stock of
 Cattle Hogs and Sheep one Large Iron dish and four plates also my wife
 to one Casey to him his Heirs and assigns for ever And Lastly I do constitute
 and Appoint a Mayr Professor and notary

and Appoint a Maj^r Joseph Juggs and my son Samuel Campbell Executors of
this my last Will and Testament who is to settle & attend at my Wifes debts,
and of the said Revolt and make void all former Wills by me made declaring
and none other to be my last Will and Testament. In Witness whereof I have
hereunto set my hand and affixed my Seal this 29th day of August in the Year
of our Lord One thousand four hundred and Eighty
