the full exercise of my reason and memory Thanks be to Almighty God and
calling to mind the Mortality of my Body and knowing that it is appointed
for all men to die, do make and Ordain this my last Will and Testament
Infirmities I will that out of that Estate with which it hath pleased
God to Bless me in this life all my Just debts be punctually paid and
after the Payment thereof I give demise and dispose of the same in
the following manner I do give to my son in law Stephen Sanders the Land
and Plantations whereon I now live containing two hundred Acres to him and his
Heirs for ever, only reserving to John Otey one Acre whereon his Mill now stands
provided the said Otey agreeable to a former Bargain shall keep the said Mill in
repair and Grind all the Grain the said Sanders shall want for the use of the
said plantation, or any Other Person into whose hands the said Land may fall
and on failure the said Acre of Land is to revert to the said Sanders his Heirs
or Assigns Item I bequeath to my Daughter Ann Trivitt two Negroes Tom & Lucy for
during her natural life and at her decease to be Equally divided Between her
two daughters Mildred and Elizabeth also I give to my daughter Ann Trivitt
one Feather Bed and Furniture Item I give to my son John Mayross and to my
Daughter Frances Smith one Negroe Boy Peter to be Equally divided Between
them Item I give to my Daughter Elizabeth Lefurche one Negroe boy Caesar
to her and her Heirs also a small House and Land

Impiunus I will that out of that Estate with which it hath pleased
God to Bless me in this life all my just debts be punctually paid and
after the payment thereof I give ~~leave~~ ^{leave} and dispose of the same in
the following manner I give to my son in law Stephen Sanders the Land
and plantations whereon I now live containing two hundred Acres to him and his
Heirs for ever, only reserving to John Oley one Store whereon his Mill now stands
provided the said Oley agreeable to a former Bargain shall keep the said Mill in
repair and Grind all the Grain the said Sanders shall want for the use of the
said plantation, or any other person unto whose hands the said Land may fall
and on failure the said Acre of Land is to revert to the said Sanders his Heirs
or Assigns Item I Give to my Daughter Ann Jarril two Negroes Lory & Fear
during her natural life and at her decease to be Equally divided Between her
two daughters Mildred and Elizabeth also I give to my daughter Ann Jarril
one Feather Bed and Furniture Item I give to my son John Haynes and to my
Daughter Frances Smith one Negroe Boy Peter to be Equally divided Between
them Item I give to my Daughter Elizabeth Lofurich one Negroe boy Ceason
to her and her Heirs also a civil Horse called Pompey Item I give to my
Son William Haynes one Negroe man named James to him and his Heirs
Item I give to my daughter Mildred Sanders one Negroe Woman named

I give to her and her Heirs Item I give to my daughter Mary Long one Negro Girl
 named Judith, to her and her Heirs Item I give to Elizabeth Sanders ^{Eldest}
 Daughter of Stephen Sanders and attested his Wife one Negro Girl named Sally, to
 her and her Heirs Item I give to my son Henry Haynes one Bay Horse and
 all the residue of my Estate I give to be Equally divided Between my daughter
 Elizabeth Lafunch and my son Henry Haynes Further the said Henry one
 shepherd Bid and Surety to Accounting with the said Elizabeth for the Value
 thereof in the Above division, And I do Constitute and Appoint William
 Lafunch and Stephen Sanders Executors of this my last Will and Testament
 In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal this Eighth day
 of April one thousand seven Hundred and Eighty
