Shilling Sterling. Item I bequeath unto my son John Scott one shilling Sterling

Item I bequeath unto my son Thomas Scott one shilling Sterling

Item I bequeath unto my son William Scott one shilling Sterling

Item I bequeath unto my son Robert Scott one shilling Sterling

Item I bequeath unto my son Charles Scott one shilling sterling.

Item I bequeath unto my son Afton Scott one shilling sterling.

Item I bequeath unto my son Joseph Scott one shilling sterling.

Item I bequeath unto my son Abiah Scott one shilling sterling.

Item I bequeath unto my son Peter Scott one shilling sterling and also

my moveable Effects Goods & Chattels after his mother's Decease

Item I bequeath unto my son Evan Scott one shilling sterling.

Item I do appoint my beloved sons James Scott & George Scott my
sole Executors And I do hereby utterly Disallow revoke & annul all &
every other former Testament & Wills by me in any ways before named.

Agreeable to the Order of this Court we whose names are hereunto subscribed have
laid off and allotted to Sarah Thornhill widow & Relict of William Thornhill
Deceased her dower in the said William Thornhill Deceased Estate by means &
bounds to wit one hundred & forty three acres of Land part of the tract the said
William died seized off. Beginning at a Spanish Oak Corner to Thomas Softwicks
& Christopher Clarks Land thence North fifty nine degrees West one hundred &
fifty four poles to painters in Thornhills line thence along his line North twenty
Degrees West thirty two poles to Thornhills Corner Black Oak thence along his
line North fifty six degrees East two hundred & thirty two poles to his Corner
thence along his line South thirty four Degrees
