1) I have this last Will and Testament
Touching Such Worldly Estate wherewith it hath
pleased God to Bless me within this Life. I give
Remain and Dispose of the Same in the Following
Manner and form. I give to my Son
Stephen Trigg the Part of Land which he hath shared
with Edward Donohoe for being the place called
Folsom's Mountain to him and his heirs and
forever. I give to my Son William Trigg the
Negro fellow he has now in Possession named
Anthony to him and his heirs forever. I
give to my Son Stephen Trigg the Negro Wench
Anny he has now in Possession together with her
Increase to him and his heirs forever. I give
to my Son Daniel Trigg one Negro named Sam

Together with one one feather Bed and furniture and two
 cows and calves two Sows and Piggs To him and his
 heirs forever. Item I give to my son J. John Trigg two
 Negroes to wit Bob and Jimmy together with two Cows
 and calves and two Sows and Piggs and all the Household
 furniture he has now in ^{possession} to him and his heirs
 forever. Item I give to my son Abraham Trigg my
 Manner House and all the Land Injains in that Tract
 and one Negro Boy Named Sam and a Horse and
 Saddle and two Cows and Calves and two Sows and Piggs
 and a good feather Bed and furniture to him and his
 heirs forever. Item I give to my Daughter Nancy
 Trigg two Negroes to wit Esther and Peggy and Ten
 Pound Cash or one feather Bed and furniture and one
 Horse and Saddle to Value of fifteen Pounds to be Paid
 out of my Estate when she comes of Age or Marries to her

and her heirs forever. Item I give to my Daughter
Lockey Trigg two Negroes to with Lelt and Peler
and ten Pounds Cash or one feather Bed and furniture
and One Horse and Saddle to Value of fifteen Pounds
to be Passed out of my Estate when She comes of Age or
Marries to her and heirs forever. Item I lend unto
my Beloved Wife Mary Trigg all the Residue of my
Estate During her Natural Life and at her Death to be
Equally Divided amongst my following Children to wit
William Trigg and Stephen Trigg Daniel Trigg and
John Trigg and Abraham Trigg and Nancy Trigg
and Lockey Trigg to them and their heirs forever.
And I do appoint my Beloved Wife Mary Trigg
Executrix and my Son John Trigg Executor of this my
Last Will and Testament. In Witness whereof
