

in your hand No the Name of God amen I George Lyman of the County of Bedford being sick and weak in body but of sound mind & disposing memory for which I thank God and calling to mind the uncertainty of human life and being desirous to dispose of all such worldly estate as it hath pleased God to bless me with I Give and bequeath the same in manner following that is to say First I give unto my beloved wife Eve Lyman this tract of Land whereon I now dwell with the house and all the improvements thereon with all the household furniture farming utensils and tools of every kind that I possess and all the stock of Cattle Hogs and Horses and Sheep and also to draw all the Money that is in my hands or shall come in by note bonds or any other accounts from all persons indebted to me whatever also I allow my wife to administer an my Estate at my decease until after her death I also give and bequeath to my well beloved son George Markington Lyman the Tract of Land on which I now live so far as to Big Flat Creek to the line I lawfully properly after the death of my wife and I give George Markington Lyman one Negro boy named Song to the line properly after the death of my wife Also I will & bequeath unto my daughter Mary Ann Lyman all the Tract of Land on the South side of Big Flat Creek between Big Flat Creek and Joseph Floorey Lane and Lancaster Shovers Lane and also I will unto the aforesaid Mary

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Am I give thirty five acres of Land to be taken out of my hundred & thirty five acre tract of Land lying between Joseph Glover McLean Mear and Esquire Shotts line the said thirty five acres to begin at the Corner Joseph Glover and Esquire Shotts to run along Esquire Shotts line to William Ship line at my Corner and then run round for Complement the said tract to be her and her heirs forever I also will and bequeath to my daughter bety Lynn one hundred acres of Land lying between Joseph Glover Robert Hastings and butchers road line the same to be her and her heirs forever I also will that the balance of my Estate be equally divided between my three children at my wifes death hereby ^{revoking} ~~making~~ all former wills ^{void} ~~made~~ in which I have hereto set my hand and seal this 20th day of September 1820
