I, the name of God Amen. I Hester Vanmeter of the County of Botetourt
 town of Pattonburg, being in a low state of health, but of sound mind and
 disposing memory, do make and ordain this as my last Will and Testament.
 In the first place I direct my funeral charges and Debts to be paid
 and do hereby Will and bequeath unto my Daughter Sarah Sweetland the
 wife of E. Sweetland Botetourt County Virginia Wills 1829-1838
 www.virginiapioneers.net for her benefit in the hands of my Grandson Mc
 Henry a trustee appointed for that purpose the sum and tott including
 all the real estate lately purchased by me at a sale made by James L. Woodch
 is trustee to a Dec^d in trust executed by my son in law E. Sweetland and be
 wife abt. all the personal property purchased at said sale including a neg
 ro girl Lucy and her child all the household and kitchen utensils, a more par
 ticular description thereof will more fully appear by a reference to a list
 of said property & all the aforesaid property real and personal in hereby de
 vote the disposal of my Grandson McHenry a trustee for my
 Daughter the aforesaid property real and personal aforesaid to be for her sole
 benefit and use.

1^{stly} I will and bequeath unto my Grand Daughter E. Swettland a large flat
bank.

2^{ndly} I do hereby Will and bequeath the balance of my Estate at my decease
one half to my daughter Sarah Swettland and the other half to my daughter
in law Hannah's Heiresses and her Children by my son Joseph Warriner,
all such property or Estate to be placed in the hands of my said trustee for the
sole use and benefit of my said daughter and daughter in law, and her Children
aforesaid, and the said Martin McFerran is hereby empowered to make use of the
same for the benefit of those persons as by this Will directed and for the benefit of
me or else, as he may deem proper for their support.

3^{rdly} Whereas my said son Joseph is in difficulties in a pecuniary point of view
and respects are long to be retained in such difficulties. Should so desirable an
event happens, I do in that case if my said trustee should deem it advisable,
Will and direct that his power cease, and the trust fund aforesaid be given up to
my said son to be by him disposed of or used for his and family's benefit, as he
may deem advisable.

4^{thly} Whereas it will no doubt be attended with much difficulty in
settling the trust fund of my estate. Having full Confidence in my Grand
son and trustee, I do will and direct that his acts be taken and deemed correct
both in law & equity in settlement of the same.

5^{thly} I will and direct that my Executor herein after named pay to each of my
other Children one Dollar as their part of my Estate, and to the heir of Thomas
McFerran one Dollar. Also one Dollar to the heir of Charles Medick Dec
9^{thly} and lastly. I do hereby appoint my Grandson Martin McFerran

I do hereby appoint my Grandson Martin M. Ferrand sole
Executor of this my Last Will and testament (who is not to be held to Security
as such) and trustee aforesaid, hereby revoking all former Wills by me made
and declaring this to be my last Will and testament. In testimony whereof
I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal and subscribed my name
this day of July in the Year of our Lord 1835.
