Memorandum of the Last will and Testament of Philip Prook Dec^d Taken down
by Peter Frantz November 22nd 1829 Philip Prook being of sound mind but weak in body
stated his Last will and Testament as follows He wills his wife Susannah all that he
left behind to maintain her as long as she lived except first and for ever that to his son
Philip he wills all his blacksmiths tools and to his Daughter Mary and her husband
Isaac further his will that his son Philip shall live with his mother and take care of her
as long as she lived and after her death all that is left behind should be divided in equal
parts amongst all his Children
