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In the name of God. Amen. I Thomas Wilson of the County of
Potomac, being in health of body and of sound mind and memory (for
which I thank God,) and calling to mind the uncertainty of human
life, and being desirous to dispose of all such worldly estate
as it hath pleased God to bestow me with in this life. I Give and bequeath
all the same in the manner first writing, that is to say. First it is my
Wish that all my Just and Lawfull Wills and Demands against
any Person out of my estate. Immediately after the Payment of my Debts
and Demands against all persons at once and lawfully being paid the same

I am Thomas Wilson, all my Tract of Land adjoining the State
 mountain. Thirdly, I Give and bequeath to his son James Wilson,
 undivided half of The Tract of Land purchased of John Ball-

 one hundred acres in place of the ninety acres mentioned in his
