Examine

I, Timothy M. Patterson of the County of Botetourt
and State of Virginia do make this my last will and
testament wishing all them in the first place I command
my soul to that being from whence it emanated my body
to be decently interred at the foot of my brother Samuel
Graves by my Moravian Brethren as to my worldly goods
I leave and bequeath them to my wife Margaret to
do with them as she may think proper with the counsel
and advice of my two Executors whom I shall hereafter
name after paying all my just debts with this proviso
that Mary Beck shall keep the Negro girl Mary Hypp
her two Sisters are buried a dollar each it has been my
intention for some time past should I live to put my
two Nephews in the mercantile line if it is therefore my
wish that when my debts are collected that the sum of
five hundred dollars may be sent to them for that purpose

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name after paying all my Just debts with the proviso
that Mary Tech shall keep the Negro girl Mary & pay
her her Sister Ann Ann & Hollan each it has been my
Intention for some time past should I live to put my
two Nephews in the Mercantile business it is therefore my
wish that when my debts are collected that the sum of
five thousand Dollars may be sent to them for that purpose
they giving security for the same and what they shall
have the right to sell or lease if they wish it
and paying my Wife the Law full Interest as she
may stand in need of it if it should happen
that my Wife should agree with Children the whole
of my Estate is to go to it and if not at her
Death to the Children of my Sister Hannah to wit Mary
Peck Chiga both Catharine M^{rs} to M^{rs} Mary & Mary M^{rs}
and Robert M^{rs} to be equally divided between them

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The balance due me from my Father's Estate in Pennsylvania
I leave to Nathaniel Wier if he thinks proper to look after
it, I constitute and appoint John W. Thompson and
James L. Woodville my Executors to this my last Will
Witness my hand and seal as Legatee by my own hand
this 31st day of November 1843

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This is a bequest to my Will I claim nothing from the
heirs of John W. Greary dec'd for my services as Admin-
istrator I leave to Greary M. Greary are hundred
Dollars If Nathaniel Wier thinks proper to study
Medicine I leave to him my Medical Books and
Ship I wish J. W. Thompson to collect all my bonds
and accounts in sum the same as he is allowed
Six per Cent.
