In the name of God Amen I William Ballovin of the County of Botetourt being of Disposing mind do make and execute this my last will and Testament I direct that all my just Debts & funeral expences be first paid I give and devise to my beloved wife Nancy all my household & Kitchen furniture to her & her heirs forever and all the stock of every description that I own on the plantation on which we now live consisting of horses, cattle, sheep & together with all the grain land so that there may be in the place at my decease and also the wagons carts and all manner of utensils which I shall ~~be~~ be possessed of belonging to the farm and also one carriage. It is my will that my daughter have an afternoon to pay to my wife ~~Botetourt County Virginia Wills 1824-1829~~ her when we were married amount of presents not recollect but it may be ascertained by reference to our books I desire also to my wife the further sum of three Thousand Dollars to be paid out of my Estate and my servant boy Albert I devise to her and her Heirs forever To my daughter Mary Surr I give one thousand Dollars to her and her heirs forever To my nephew Mr. - Ballovin son of my Sister Jane I give my gold Watch and one Thousand Dollars to my Niece (I think her name is Mary) daughter of my Sister Jane I give one Thousand dollars I have given to me to nephew Mr. Saals Wm. Kyle Roberts Saals and Robert Ballovin as much of my Estate as I intend for them and it is my desire that they receive nothing more To my Brother in the Ballovin note on Ireland I give one half of the new

due at my Estate to him and his heirs forever. I give to my Sister Mary
one fourth of residue ^{said} to her and her heirs which sum in like manner
I give to my Sister Elizabeth Kyle the balance of my Estate which
is the other fourth of said residue to her and her heirs in like manner.
The Stone in which I am interested in Finecaste and Gardner of the
Patton will be carried on as usual after my death - in
Year Eighty that no new grows are to be laid in with the exception
of such grows as may be deemed necessary. What ever additional

they be disposed of to the best advantage by me Executors on a credit of
twelve months the purchase money to be security for my wife the
estate in the same manner for the space of five years

and then left by me Executors the balance of my inheritance not specifically
mentioned I wish sold - The rents in my real property in Finecaste
I wish applied to the education of my Sister Jane Calhoun the student
if she should come to this country - appoint my Friends James Madison
Woodville and Thomas J. Barrell Executors of this my last Will and Testament
in Testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this 1st day of
April 1826.
