In the name of God amen I William Calhoun of the County of
Botetourt being of Disposing mind do make and ordain this my last
will and Testament I direct that all my Just Debts & Funerals Expences
be first paid I give and devise to my beloved Wife many all my household
& Kitchen furniture to her & her heirs forever and all the Stock of
every Description that I own on the plantation on which we now live con-
sisting of horses & cattle sheep &c together with all the grain land &c that there
may be in the place at any time used also the waggon carts and all fur-
nishing utensils which I shall ^{the} possessed of belonging to the farm and
also one Chariage It is my will that my Executors hereinafter named
pay to my Wife ^{Botetourt County, Virginia Wills 1824-1829} ^{www.virginiapioneers.net} her when we were married
amount of personal estate not recollected but it may be ascertained by refer-
rence to our books I devise also to my Wife the further sum of three thousand
Dollars to be paid out of my Estate and my servant boy Albert I devise
to her and her heirs forever To my third daughter I give one thousand
Dollars to her and her heirs forever To my Nephew W^m Calhoun son of
my Sister Anne I give my gold Watch and one thousand Dollars To my
Niece (I think her name is Mary) daughter of my Sister Lane I give one
thousand dollars I have given to my Nephews W^m Scott W^m Kyle
Robert Scott and Robert Calhoun as much of my Estate as Iinten-
ded for them and it is my desire that they receive nothing more To my
Brother John Calhoun now in Ireland I give one half of the new

Due of my Estate to him and his heirs forever. I give to my Sister Mary
one fourth of ^{said} residue to my Sister to her and her heirs which I have in England
I give to my Sister Christiana Ryte the balance of my Estate which
is the other fourth of said residue to her and her heirs in England
The Stone in which I am interested in Fincastle and a barner of the
Patton I wish to be carried on as usual after my Death and on
my Gravel that no new graves are to be laid in with the Exception
of such graves as may be deemed necessary. What ever goods
and are the end of the two months of my Decease It is my Will
they be disposed of to the best advantage by my Executors on a credit of
twelve months the purchase money to be paid in security. It is my wish that
my property in Fincastle be sold for the space of five years
and then sold by my Executors the balance of my property not specifically
mentioned I wish sold. The Tent of my real property in Fincastle
which applied to the education of my Sister Jane Calhoun's two children
if they should come to this country I appoint my Friends James L
Woodville and Thomas P. Burwell Executors of this my last Will and Testament
In Testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 4th day of
April 1826.
