Principly and first of all I recommend my soul to god who gave it my body to be buried in a decent Christian like manner at the discrepion of my Executors First that my just debts ^{Botetourt County Virginia Wills 1824-1829} ^{www.virginiapioneers.net} be first paid & satisfied, I leave & bequeath to my sister Lenny Wallare all my lands and all my living both out of the House & in the House during her natural life with some Exceptions to make use of as is judged most most necessary for the benefit of herself & my Children that she may be schooled as much as opportunity possibly will afford and at the death of my sister Lenny Wallare I allow all my lands to be Equally divided amongst my three Sons David, William, & James and the moveable property to be Equally divided in five parts amongst my five ~~daughters~~ Children Except two beds with bedding I allow my two Daughters Sally & Polly with what ever improvement she can make with what they have among their hands while their aunt is with them, I allow

judged most necessary, I appoint my sister Penny Wallare and my son David
Wallare to be Executrix & Executor of this my last will & Testament Disallowing of all
others from this back.
