following that is to say First I desire that all my Last Debts & funeral
expenses be paid & only after the payment of my Debts and funeral
expenses I gave to my wife Sam Wornack one third part of
my Estate both Real as a person as for and during the Term
of her Natural Life & after her death I give the
same to my Children having after mentioned equally to the share
among them & only I give and devise unto my eldest Son James
Wornack all my Lands on which I now reside it being
in Botetourt County Virginia Wills, 1824-1829

the said Tract of Land called the
Keezy Tract to him and his heirs forever & only I give
and devise unto my Son Joseph Wornack the Tract of
Land I purchased of Cary & Pitzer and also the other Lands
adjoining which I purchased of Edward Harris & Susan his
wife of which she was endowed as the widow of the said
Cary & Pitzer lying on James River at the mouth of Little
and Simpson Creeks also all my right and Interest which I
have on a Contract with my Uncle Maford Wornack
to him and his heirs forever I also direct that my Son James
Wornack be at half the cost of the said

N. Marmack be at half the expense of burying said Eliza
5th It is my will and desire that all my negroes be equally
divided also my household and Kitchen furniture of every
kind among my four children namely James N. Joseph &
Elizabeth Sarah & Marmack to them and their heirs forever
My Negro man is named whom I give with my Carpenter
Black Smith Cooper and Shoemaker tools for the use
of my wife Jane son James N. Joseph & to their heirs
5th I also give and bequeath unto my two daughters all articles &
Sarah & the sum of one thousand five hundred Dollars appears
to be paid them as soon as the money can be collected to them
further I also give to my said two daughters a horse trade and
a saddle a piece worth one hundred dollars a piece when
the attain the age of fourteen years to them forever it is also
my will and desire that my said two daughters have a home
in the house in which I now reside so long as the remain un-
married 7th I also give and bequeath unto my two sons James
N. & Joseph & Marmack all my stock and farming utensils of

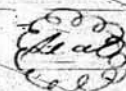

For as I also give to my said two daughters a home to live and
I state a piece worth one hundred dollars a piece when
the attorn the age of fourteen years to them forever it is also
my will and desire that my said two daughters have a home
in the house in which I now reside so long as they remain un-
married. If they I also give and bequeath unto my two sons James
M & Joseph & Monack all my stock and farming utensils of
every kind to be equally divided to them forever
If they I in my will and I authorize my Executors herein after
named at their own discretion and so long as they think it
most advisable to keep all the property together and undivided
to cultivate and work my different tracts of Land in the manner

the thing best and take the proceeds and apply it to the
 maintenance and education of my four children having
 before named and should any surplus remain in the
 hands of my Executors from time to time the are not to pay
 any interest and I direct that my said Executors shall not
 be required to give security or do I require that any property
 be appraised but as I am dying I am satisfied that my property
 is good See the rest of my Estate both real and personal of
 what name or kind soever it may be not herein before
 particularly described and in any way be equally divided
 among my two sons James W & Joseph H Womack which
 I give to them their heirs Executors Administrators assigns
 forever to they and lastly I do hereby constitute & appoint
 my wife Jane Womack and James H Womack of this my
 last will and Testament hereby revoking all other or former
 wills or Testaments by me heretofore made I in witness
 whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed
 my seal this 6th day of March in the Year 1828
