In the name of God Amen I Benjamin Harrison of the
County of Brunswick do hereby declare this to be my last Will and Testament in manner
and form as followeth (Vizt) That my Daughters Sally and Mary
Harrison have the use of the House wherein I reside and as much of
my Land as shall be necessary for them to cultivate during their natural
lives or until they marry. the part so to be appropriated to be as nearly
a round and contiguous to the House as their situation will permit

I lend to my Daughter Sally Harrison my Negro man named Randle during
her natural life or until she shall marry after which period I give the
said negro to my son John Harrison to him and his heirs forever I give to my
Daughter Sally Harrison my Negroes Silver and Wincy with their
increase from this date. one bay Horse known by the name of
Dancer one womans saddle & Bridle one feather Bed and furniture to
her and her heirs forever. I Give to my Daughter Mary Harrison
my Negroes Finney & Murrey with their increase from this date. one bay horse known
by the name of Buck. one womans saddle & Bridle one Bed and furniture

I give to my son Benjamin Harrison one negro boy named Dick to
him and his heirs forever I give to my son Charles Harrison all the Tract of
Land & premises together with all the appurtenances thereto belonging
whereon I now live to him and his heirs forever. I Give to my Daughters
Sally & Mary Harrison all my flock of born stock of Hogs cattle &c
to them and their heirs forever. The rest of my Children not named in this Will
being hereafter provided for by me I Give them five shillings each as their
full proportion of my estate. My Will is that my Estate be not appraised
nor my Executor required to give security. I appoint my son Charles
Harrison Executor of this my will Witness my hand and seal this
26th Day of September one thousand seven hundred and Ninety Nine
