In the name of God Amen
I Robert of the County of Brunswick & Parish of Saint Andrew being sick & weak
in body but sound mind & memory & knowing that it is appointed for all men
once to die do make & ordain & constitute this my last Will & Testament
I Infirm: I do desire that my body may be buried in a secret & Christian
like manner at the discretion of my Executors hereafter mentioned, my soul
I commit into the power of that Great & Merciful God who gave it. in hopes
of its joyful resurrection through the merits of Jesus Christ. And as to
what worldly estate it hath pleased God to endow me with I dispose of them
in manner & form following (To wit) I Give I leave unto my beloved wife
Frances Roberts all my property during her natural life on these
terms that my four youngest Children may be raised without any
manner of Expence, if not that the same may equally divided amongst
the said Children that is Richard, Nancy, Benjamin & William
to their & theirs heirs forever. I Give I bequeath to my Daughter
Polly Roberts at the death of my wife Twenty Shillings to her & her heirs
forever. I Give I bequeath to my son John Roberts at the death
of my wife Twenty Shillings to him & his heirs forever. I Give I bequeath
to my son Samuel Roberts at the death of my wife Twenty Shillings to
him & his heirs forever. I Give I bequeath to my son William
Roberts at the death of my wife Twenty Shillings to him & his heirs forever.
