to made partaker of eternal happiness: and as for my estate which it hath

bequeath to my beloved wife all my Land & plantation during her natural life &
at her decease I give it to my Daughter Ariadna Elmyra Smith to her & her
heirs forever and all the rest of my estate after paying my just debts I
give to be equally divided between my wife Martha & my Daughter
Ariadna Elmyra Smith to them & their heirs forever and do
request that my wife Martha Smith & James Catbick be executors & overseers
of this my last Will & Testament given under my hand & seal this twenty
seventh day of July One thousand eight hundred & three
