I hereby declare that all my just debts & several expenses be paid out of my estate. I give & bequeath unto my son Moses Whelan all my Land & plantation wherein I now live to him & his heirs forever. I give & bequeath unto Frances Whelan my left hand to be raised out of my estate before division takes place to her & her heirs forever. I give & bequeath that all my Negroes be sold by my Executor to be hereafter named and the money arising from each of Negroes to be equally divided amongst my beloved wife Elizabeth Whelan Sarah Whelan, Mary Whelan, Elizabeth Whelan, Lucy Morris, Hannah Morris & my daughter Mary Whelan.

5th

I bequeath unto my son James Wheeler the bed furniture whomever whomever
now lies at my death I have at my death of clothes except my old Iron
I give I bequeath unto my beloved Daughter Hannah Driver one
piece of the bed furniture to her & her heirs forever. I give I bequeath
unto Elizabeth Lightfoot Daughter of Moses Wheeler one piece of
furniture to her & her heirs forever. I give I bequeath unto my
wife Elizabeth Wheeler one piece of furniture also one Load of
my belonging there to one or chest one Dutch Oven one Fire
one side of saddle one new bag with one little pot, one Mug one
pewter Dish one basin one flat Iron two new sheep one two new
Lamb in lieu of power to her & her heirs forever. I bequeath
that the residue of my estate let it be of what kind ever after paying my
Daughter Frances McHenry her legions I bequeath to be paid to me out
out of my estate and then the balance or residue to be shared out
with Elizabeth Wheeler Mary Wheeler Mary Wheeler Elizabeth Wheeler
Morris, Hannah Driver & William Driver to them & their heirs forever.
Lastly I constitute & appoint my son James Wheeler executor of this my
last Will & Testament trusting all other Wills & Testaments to be null & void
