 one Cow and my great chest with all things contained therein to him
 and his heirs forever, Item I give and bequeath to my son Elisha Ridde
 all the remainder of my estate of what kind soever to him and his heirs forever
 And lastly I constitute and appoint Elisha Ridde my whole & sole executor

 of my brother John Sturdivant Ten pounds to each one
