Fred'k Cook's In the Name of God Amen I Frederick  
Cook of Brunswick County State of Virginia being very weak & sick  
in body but of perfect mind memory thanks be to God for  
the same & willing to mind the malady of my body and  
knowing that is appointed for all men to die do make and  
ordain this my last will and Testament, That is to say principally  
first of all I give & command my soul into the hands of Almighty  
God that gave it and my body I commend to the earth to be  
buried in a decent Christian like manner at the discretion  
of my friends nothing doubting but at the general resurrection  
I shall rise the same again by the mighty power of God. And  
I do further direct & command it hath pleased

382 First I desire that all of my just debts should be paid out of my estate.  
Second I give to my three children that of age to wit) Martha Millegarde  
Rebecca took the sum of Twenty pounds Virginia money to be raised  
out of my estate. Third I leave to my dearly beloved wife Lucy the  
balance of my estate both real & personal during widowhood only my  
children that are under age to wit, Charles, John, Wesley, Nancy Lucy,  
William, Robert Cook shall as they severally come of age have the  
above mentioned sum of Twenty pounds with debts, Balances of Stocking  
as their mother shall think fit out of the above mentioned just estate. And  
in case that my wife Lucy's widowhood should expire before my will the  
aforeward infants shall arrive at their age when such infant shall be infants  
at that expiration shall be entitled to the aforesaid sum of Twenty pounds  
and the balance of the aforesaid estate at the aforesaid expiration to be  
sooner or later I will to be sold and the money arising therefrom to be  
divided among the whole of my aforesaid children who then  
will be <sup>13</sup> years old. Daniel & Rebecca in such sort that each Lucy children  
part a legacy, shall be double the sum of <sup>13</sup> to each  
Fourth I constitute my self Executrix & Testator of this my will  
Will and testament my wife Lucy & others to Margot, wife & co  
Livery disposition revoked & disannul all & every other former Testament  
Wills Legacies bequests & Executors by me in any wise before named  
Witness & bequeathed ratifying & confirming this my other to be  
my last will and testament. In witness whereof I have this day  
set my hand & seal this 19<sup>th</sup> day of February in the year of our Lord 1805

His last will and testament in the presence of

of us who in his presence and in the presence of each other have hereunto Subscribed our names, of Frederick Cook etc was proved to the author of  
John White - the witness whereof is to be recorded. On the andance  
John White Jr. of Lucy Cook his wife thereto named whomade  
William White Both these according to Law and together with Willis  
Harrison White son of her deceased entered into and acknowledged a  
bond in the penalty of Fifteen hundred pounds with condition as the  
law directs Certificate is granted herfor obtaining a Probate whereupon  
same story being reserved the executor thereto named to have on the  
wheca when he may think fit <sup>date</sup> of Herbert Mull C.C.
