sound and perfect memory, do make this my last Will and Testament in manner and form
as followeth. I Give to my wife Susanna Stainbach her right and dower. And
my Will and desire is that my wife may live with my son, William Stainbach during
her life and that the said William Stainbach shall have the benefit of the said
right and dower, accepting a sufficient support during her life, I Give unto
my son Thomas Stainbach, and his heirs the sum of Five shillings Current money.
I Give to my Daughter Mary Walsale, and to her heirs the sum of five shillings
Current money. I Give to my son John Stainbach and to his heirs the sum of
five shillings Current money. I Give to my son George Stainbach and to his
heirs the sum of Five shillings Current money. I Give to my son Francis
Stainbach and to his heirs the sum of five shillings Current money.
I Give to my son William Stainbach all the rest of my estate both real and personal
of what nature and property whatsoever, to him his heirs and assigns forever, and
I do appoint William Stainbach whole and sole Executor of this my last Will and Testament
revoking and annulling all other Wills heretofore made In Testimony whereof
I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this seventeenth day of
February, One thousand seven hundred and ninety six
