I give and bequeath unto my Grandson Amos Heartwell the Negro boy
named I give and bequeath unto my Grand Daughter Nancy Heartwell
the daughter of my son Paul Heartwell Little Fanny a child of
my Negro woman Anne to her this he has forever. I give and bequeath
to my son Richard Heartwell five shillings & I give to him and his heirs for
ever I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Hannah Heartwell during
her natural life three Negroes viz: Diah Ann & Celia I also further bed
& furniture with all the remainder of my estate that here is mentioned
and after her death I give the above mentioned Negroes viz: Diah Ann
and Celia & their future increase with all the residue of my estate that I
lent to my beloved wife unto my son Paul Heartwell to him this he has forever
I do appoint my son Paul Heartwell as my whole & sole executor
to this my last will and Testament & to keep my hand Seal this 10
day of December in the Year of our Lord 1796.
