Wells } Brunswick and State of Virginia, being weak & near my end
and many thanks be to God for the same and bating to mind the mortality
of my body and knowing it is appointed for all men once to die Hoping at
the General Resurrection to be raised to life eternal that the witness
of my Soul & Saviour Jesus Christ has Touching such worldly estate
and hath pleased God to bless me with I have & expose in Manuscript
as follows:— I give and bequeath unto my son Isaac
Heartwell the Negro boy by the name of Orange with one further
bed & furniture to him this heers forever. But if in case he should depart
this life without a lawfull heir begotten of his body my name is that the
said Negro boy named Orange the feather bed & furniture I bequeath to
him may return to my Grandson Amos Heartwell to him this
I give the Negro boy by the name of Henry the Negro Squire (or man) named ^{that} Heartwell to him this heers
forever. I give and bequeath unto my Grandson Amos Heartwell
Heartwell the Negro girl named Sja to him this heers forever. I
give and bequeath unto my Grand Daughter Nancy Heartwell
the daughter of my son Paul Heartwell Little Furniture consisting
my Negro woman Anne to her this heers forever. I give and bequeath
to my son Richard Heartwell five shillings & Lent to him and his heers for
ever. I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Hannah Heartwell during
her Natural life three Negroes Viz: Dinah Nancy Hilda & one feather bed
& furniture with all the remainder of my estate that here is mentioned
and after her death I give the above mentioned Negroes Viz: Dinah Nancy
and Hilda & her future increase with all the residue of my estate that I
Lent to my beloved wife unto my son Paul Heartwell to him this heers forever
Also I do appoint my son Paul Heartwell as my whole & Sole executor
of my will & confirming the same after it is by my last will & testament
to this my last will and Testament. At Witness my hand & Seal this 10
day of December in the Year of our Lord 1796.
