First my Will and desire is that all my Just Debts be paid out of such part of my Estate as my wife may choose to part with for that purpose I do desire that my Executors make a deed to William Kennedy for that part of the Land sold him agreeable to the Lines laid off and agreed on between the said Kennedy and myself on his paying to my Executors the balance of the consideration for the said Land
2^{dly} My will and desire is that one Hundred Acres at the lower end (or more if my execs think fit) of the Land bought of William Goddard be sold by my Executors for the payment of Debts as aforesaid 3^{dly} All the rest of my Estate real and personal, I bind to my beloved wife Abigail Jordan during her life for the support and Maintenance of herself and my Children, with the privileges of advancing any of my Children in life out of the same, during her life & at her Death my will & desire is that all the residue thereof be equally divided between my surviving Children, having regard in such division to the sums that may have been advanced to any in her life time so that all my Children may as nearly as may be Equally be benefited by my Estate except my son John to whom after the death my wife aforesaid, I give and bequeath the Land and plantation whereon I now live together with such part of my other Estate as my wife may think convenient to give him during her life to him and his heirs for ever, and after her Death he is not to be considered as one of my residuary legatees I do hereby appoint my beloved wife Abigail my Administrator and my
