Jesse Jones's Will
In the Name of God Amen, May 5th 1795
I Jesse Jones of the County of Brunswick and Parish of Albemarle
being in perfect sense and memory do make and contain this to be
my last Will and Testament and for what worldly estate it hath
pleases God, to bless me with in this life I give devise and dispose
of in the following manner and form following (viz) I Give
bequeath unto my wife Sarah Jones all my Estate that I now
possess both real and personal (to wit) five Negroes ~~namely~~ ^{to wit} Sam Manson
Luce, Chris and Bob with my Stock of all kinds Household &
Kitchen furniture of every kind my will and desire is that my
wife shall keep my children with her untill my ^{whole term of age} youngest ^{or} the
death of my wife and then my will and desire is after her death that
my estate be equally divided among my children my will and desire is
that my wife shall live here and keep possession of my House and Land
with all that is above written during her natural life and then to be
equally divided among my children Lastly I do appoint my wife
Sarah Jones and my son Hicks Jones executors to this my last will

and Testaments.

of the County of Brunswick being of sound and perfect mind &
memory (Blessed be God) do this eight day of September in the
year of our Lord, Christ one thousand seven hundred and
ninety one make and publish This my last will and Testament
in manner and for following— I give unto my son John Hill
twenty six Shillings only having before conveyed to him what
I allotted for him — I give unto my son Isaac Hill
twenty six Shillings only having before conveyed to him what
I allotted for him — I give unto my son Thomas Hill great
Sam & Flornah to him and his heirs forever — I give unto
my son Joseph Hill two Negroes Fild & Little Sam to him &
his heirs forever also my Gray Horse — I lend unto my
Daughter Priscilla Williams The following Slaves to wit
Lucy, Suckey, Job, Jack son of Dinah, Panister — die of her
natural life and after her death I give them to all her
Children to be equally divided between them or the survivors
of them but if any one of her Children should die before
my said Daughter leaving a Child or Children in such cases
the Child or Children to come in for the parents part to them
and theirs forever — I give unto my Grand Daughter Pella
Williams two gail slaves named Anne and Grace
