Mill In the name of God amen I Thomas Maclean of the County of
Brunswick and parish of Weheven being sick and weak in body but of sound and
disposing mind and memory do make this my last Will and Testament in words and
form following Item I leave unto my Loving wife Ann Maclean one half of the Land
whereon I now live including the dwelling and other houses convenient thereto to be laid
off in the most equitable manner one half of the profits of my Mill in this County
and one third of all my Slaves including those of my son Thomas Maclean and one
dower which she may be entitled to by any Law whatsoever. Item I give and
bequeath to my loving wife Ann Maclean one dozen large and one dozen small
Silver Spoons and one third part of my personal estate after the payment of my
just debts and the legacy herein after left to my son Willis - Item I give and
bequeath unto my son in Law John Elliott, one negroe boy named Abner together
with those slaves and other property heretofore given and delivered him, and the increase
since his possession. Item I give and bequeath unto my son Willis Maclean
five hundred pounds and one hundred thereof to be paid within Twelve months after
my death, and the balance on the 25th day of December one Thousand Eight hundred
Item I give and bequeath unto my son Henry Maclean all that tract of Land lying
and being in the County of Greenville whereon he now lives, Containing by
estimation Nine hundred and forty acres and which he has a deed for to him and
his heirs forever. Item I give and bequeath unto my son Thomas Maclean
the tract of Land whereon I now live and one half of the profits of the Mill
reserving one half thereof to his mother during her life as herein before said
Item I give and bequeath unto my son Augustine Willis Maclean
