Abernathy of the County of Brunswick knowing that it is appointed of the Lord for the sons of men all to die and being in perfect at present mind and Judgment as usually do make this my last Will and Testament Revoking and Disannulling at and every other Will or gift made by me, and is as followith, Item I Give to my beloved wife the Land and plantation on which I now live also one negro Girl named Edley, the negro Girl to be during my wifes Natural live and the Land during her widow-hood and then to be equally divided between my three last Children, Item I Give to my beloved wife one Bay mare called Sue, and one hunting Saddle also one feather bed and furniture, one Chest, one Loom, and one spinning wheel, Item I Give to my beloved son John one Bay mare called Fancy one Saddle, one saw and Piggs Item I Give to my beloved daughter Rebecca one feather bed and furniture also one Cow. And all my other estate after paying my just debts I leave in the Care of my wife to raise up my Children untill my son Daniel comes to the age of sixteen years old and then to be equally divided between my wife and my three last Children And I do constitute and ordain my wife and Bro. George Wilson and Bro. Jesse Lee as Executors to this my last Will & Testament In Witness whereof I have set my hand & affixed my seal this Twenty first day of May One thousand seven hundred and ninety two Sealed & Delivered in presence of us & (Entirely before signed in the original)
