of the County of Brunswick and Parish of Setakehun knowing that I am appointed for
all men Once to live and being in a perfect sound and disposing mind not being
do make and Ordain this my last will and testament in manner following I do
testify that all my Just debts be paid I Give Hence unto my wife Ann Griffiths
my land and plantation with all my stock of every description and all ^{my} household
furniture of every description during the term of her Natural life and after her death
to be divided in Manner following. I Give to my son Thomas Griffiths my watch
said to be delivered him after my decease to him and his heirs forever. I Give
to my son Joseph Griffiths two Dollars. I Give to my son John Griffiths one
dollar I Give to my son James Griffiths one half of my land together
with one half of my ~~stock~~ ^{share} of every together with one half of my plantation
utensils together with one half of all my household and ~~other~~ ^{other} furniture of
every description to be delivered him after the decease of my wife. I Give to my
daughter Sarah Barrow two dollars. I Give to my daughter Nancy W. Barrow two dollars
I Give to my grandson Richard Griffiths the Colling day mare is now big with
at the decease of his grandmother to him and his heirs forever. I provide and declare
that my said grandson shall stay with his ^{my} grandmother until her death or he
is of lawful age. It is my will and desire that all my estate not hereby

may be after the decease of my wife and equally divided among all my children.
I nominate and appoint my wife Jane Griffiths and my son James Griffiths
executors of this my last will and Testament, nothing all and every other will heretofore
made by me. At Witness my hand and seal this 17th day of March 1802.
