In the Name of God Amen

Indian House of the
 County of Brunswick and State of Virginia being weak and low but in perfect
 sense and sound memory ^{Robert Ten Mance} and the immortality of my body and knowing
 that it is appointed for all men once to die do make and Ordain this my
 last will and Testament this eleventh day of February eighteen hundred
 and two and as it hath pleased Almighty God to bless me with a few
 worldly goods. So give and bequeath as follows I give my body to be buried in
 a Christian like manner and the Costs of my funeral expences to be paid out
 of my estate at the discretion of my Executors without doubting and Prince
 and first of all I give to my beloved wife Elizabeth House during her
 Natural life the land and Plantation Whereon I now live also all the
 estate of every description that shall become or belonging to me at my decease
 that shall not be hereafter particularly mentioned I then give and bequeath
 unto my son Claiborne House the land & Plantation I now live on after the death
 of my wife to him and his heirs for ever I then give and bequeath to my son
 Ambrose House twenty five acres of land lying on the north side of the Indian
 head Creek whereon his House now stands also Twenty Shillings current money
 of Virginia to be paid him when my estate shall be divided to him this I give for ever
 I then give and bequeath to my son Isaac House the remaining part of
 the land on the North side of the Indian head Creek and east of a
 new water line between Ambrose House and the said land also one
 shilling by the name of William and his heirs forever I then give
 and bequeath unto my daughter Elizabeth the sum of one hundred and named

money to be paid to her when my estate shall be divided to her and her heirs forever.
 Now I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Franky House one good feather
 bed and furniture to her and her heirs forever. Now I give and bequeath to my
 Daughter Betty House one good feather bed and furniture to her and her heirs forever.
 Now I give and bequeath unto my daughter Kitty Collier House one good feather
 bed and furniture to her and her heirs forever. And it is my Will and desire that my
 three Daughters that are now Single or such of them as may be Single after
 my death shall and may if they see Cause Continue with my wife without
 paying any board or anything for their Maintenance and further it is my will
 and desire after the death of my wife that all the estate given her for life
 or any Estate of mine that has not been heretofore given shall be Equally
 Divided between Isaac Flood House, Claiborne House, Franky House,
 Betty House & Kitty C. House to them and their heirs forever. Also I do
 hereby despatch and make void all other Wills by me heretofore made
 or spoken and I do constitute and appoint my two sons Isaac H. House &
 Claiborne House my whole and sole executors of this my last Will & Testament
 In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand affixed my seal the day
 and Year first above written.

 Pounds with Condition as the law directs but feeble is granted them for
 obtaining a Probate thereof in due form
