In the name of God. I, Wm Browder
of the County of Brunswick and Parish of Saint Andrews being sick &
weak in body but of sound mind & disposing memory thanks be to
god for the same do make & declare this my last will & testament
I Wm my desire is that after my decease my Executors should make
sale of as much of my estate as will pay all my just debts, I Wm
after my debts are paid I leave the whole of my estate both real and
personal to my beloved wife Suckey Browder for the maintenance
of my said wife and children during her life except one parcel
to wit which I give to my son Joseph to which I also intend to give power
which is to be taken out of his part of my estate after the death of my
afore said wife I Wm the sum of five hundred pounds which I have
already given to my son Joseph & under of the value of twenty
five pounds is also to be taken out of his part of my estate after the
division after the death of my mother I Wm my desire is that
if any of my children should marry before the death of their mother
that my said wife if she be then living should let them have an equal
part of my live stock or house furniture she thereby makes the property to
be held & paid by her said wife & mine and the amount to be taken
out of ^{there} part of my estate at the general division I Wm after the
death of my wife I give to my son Abel Browder the whole of
my Land and plantation to have his heirs & assigns forever and the rest
of my estate I leave after the death of my wife to be sold and the
money arising therefrom to be equally divided between all my children
and my two grand children Mary & Joseph Stirling Lucy the two
grand children that would have fallen to their mother Mary Lucy if
she had been living and Ladley I do hereby constitute and appoint
my wife Suckey Executrix and my son John Executor of this my
last will and testament hereby revoking all others by me made
In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hands and affixed
my seal this twentieth of January in the year Eighteen
hundred & one

His last will and testament of Joseph Brainerd said was proved by the
 oath of the witnesses there and ordered to be recorded and on the motion
 of Susanna Brainerd the Executor therein named who made oath thereof
 according to Law, and together with James Barney, John Snowdon and
 Robert Lucy, her securities entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty
 of three thousand Dollars with condition as the lawfully Certificate was
 granted her for obtaining a probate thereof in due form liberty being reserved
 to the other Executor to join in the said probate when he thought fit.
