In the Name of God Amen I Lewis Scarbrough
of the County of Brunswick and Parish of Saint Andrew
being at present in a low State of health but in divine merc-
ny, thanks be to Almighty God for the same do Affirm
and Ordain this to be my last will and Testament -
Imprimus and first of all my will and desire is that
all my just debts be duly paid and Discharged
Item I give and bequeath to my Son Samuel Scarbrough My
Tract of Land in Warren County in North Carolina containing
three Hundred Acres to him and his Heirs for ever
Item I leave the Tract of Land whereon I now live containing
two Hundred and four Acres. More or less to be sold by my
Executors hereafter mentioned to the highest bidder and the Money
arising from the Sale of the said Land I give unto my Son
Samuel Scarbrough his Heirs and assigns for ever. Item
I leave unto my Daughter Mary Jackson one Negro woman
named. Isabel and one negr named John to her and her heirs
for ever. Item I leave unto my Daughter Mary Scarbrough one
negr Boy named Daniel and one negr Boy named Sterling also
one feather bed and furniture and her Choe of my young Horses
and one Side Saddle, to her and her Heirs for ever. Item I leave
unto my Son Edward Scarbrough Ten pounds current money of

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Virginia to him and his Heirs for ever. Then I leave unto my
son Samuel Scarbrough the Negro to wit Frank Allen and Son
to him and his Heirs for ever. Then I leave unto my Daughter
Wilmouth Scarbrough One Negro Girl named Vina and one
father's Bed and furniture to her and her Heirs for ever. Then
I leave unto my Daughter Mary Scarbrough One Negro Woman
named Bet to her and her Heirs for ever. Then I leave to my
Daughter Wilmouth Scarbrough One Negro Boy named Solomon During
her Natural life and at her death my Will and desire is that
the said Negro Boy be sold and the money Equally Divided amongst
her children. Then I leave one Negro named Sam free During
his Natural life. Then I leave all the Remainder of my Estate
to be sold by my Executors and the money arising from the sale to
be Equally Divided Between Sary Jackson, Wilmouth Scarbrough
Mary Scarbrough and Samuel Scarbrough. And Lastly I
constitute and appoint Mr. John Goose John B Goldsberry &
Samuel Scarbrough my whole and sole Executors of this my last
Will and Testament. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set
my hand and Seal this 15th day of February One Thousand seven
Hundred and Ninety Seven.
