thanks be God for the same and knowing that it is appointed that all men must die do
make and ordain this my last will and Testament in manner and form following.

Imprimis I give to my son Robert Jackson my Willard fully and at the death
of my wife Martha I give my said son Robert Jackson all my lands lying in
Hancock County and State of Georgia to him and his heirs forever. Item I
give to my son Mark Jackson the large Colt to him and his heirs Item
I give to my son William Jackson the small Colt to him and his heirs.

Item I give to my sons Warren Jackson & Edmund Jackson a Colt each to be
raised from my slave and in case she should not live to raise them then
the value thereof to be paid them out of my estate. Item I lend unto my
living wife Martha Jackson all the rest and residue of my estate both

real and personal, including one negro Peter now in the possession of my son Lamy Jackson and all monies due me after the payment of my just debts during her life if she chooses to keep possession thereof until that period. If she should not I give her power of making an equal division thereof (the Land excepted) among all my children and in default of such division I leave the same at my said wife's death to be equally divided among all my children to them and their heirs forever. And I do hereby appoint my sons John Jackson and Jethro Jackson my whole and sole Executors of this my last will and Testament In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this first day of December One thousand Seven hundred and Ninety Seven
