Item I give and bequeath to my son Benjamin Goodrich the man called
Phoenix, and one bed and furniture to him and his Heirs for ever

Item I give & bequeath to my son Thomas Goodrich one bed & furniture to him
and his heirs forever. Item My Will & desire is that all the residue of my Estate
after paying my just Debts may be equally divided between my son William
Camp and my Daughter Frances Elizabeth Briggs, to them and their heirs
for ever. Last I appoint my Brother John Lamb and my son John Goodrich
whole and sole Execr's to this my last Will and Testament. In Witness whereof
