Garnish my chain and harness, the mare known by the name of the Charlotte fly  
and a bed and furniture to her and her heirs forever. Item I give & bequeath  
to my youngest son William Camp Goodrich the grey president Billy and a  
bed and furniture to him and his heirs forever

Item I give and bequeath to my son Benjamin Goodrich the mare called  
Phoenix, and a bed and furniture to him and his heirs forever

Item I give & bequeath to my son Thomas Goodrich one bed & furniture to him  
and his heirs forever. Item My Will & desire is that all the residue of my Estate  
after paying my just Debts may be equally divided between my son William  
Camp and my Daughter Frances Elizabeth Briggs, to them and their heirs  
for ever. Last I appoint my Brother John Camp and my son John Goodrich  
whole and sole Executors to this my last Will and Testament In Witness whereof  
I have hereunto set my hand & affixed my seal this ninth day of December  
one thousand seven hundred & ninety seven
