one negro man named Ned; during her life and at her death I give the said negro to
my son Buddy Harrison, to him and his heirs forever, I then I send to my loving
wife Olive Harrison all the remainder of my estate Real and personal of what kind
soever during the live of her widowhood I then I give to my son Charles Harrison
one feather bed and furniture at the death or marriage of Olive Harrison my wife
to him and his heirs forever. I then I give to my son Buddy Harrison, at the death
or marriage of Olive my wife one feather bed and furniture to him his heirs forever.
I then I give to my daughter Pally Smith at the death or marriage of Olive my
wife one feather bed and furniture to her and her heirs forever.
I then I give to my daughter Olive Smith at the death or marriage of Olive my
wife one feather bed and furniture to her and her heirs forever.
I then I give and desire a sixth part of the remainder of my estate at the
death or marriage of Olive my wife to be divided between Nathaniel Harrison
James Harrison, Juny Rivers, & Sarah Anne Harrison, in the manner following
(vizt) I give to Juny Rivers six pounds, to buy her a feather bed, to her & her heirs forever
I give also to Sarah Anne Harrison six pounds to buy her a feather bed to
her and her heirs forever, each to be made out of the above mentioned sixth part
and the remainder of the above sixth part mentioned my will and desire is that it
my be equally divided between the said Nathaniel Harrison, James Harrison
Juny Rivers and Sarah Anne Harrison to have and their heirs forever, And
if John Simmons should survive my wife my will & desire is that all my children
their uncles should contribute to support or maintain the said John Simmons
during his life and until I do constitute and appoint my son
