of the County of Drumwicks and parish of saint Andrews being at
present weak in body but in sound memory thanks be to almighty God for the
same do appoints & ordains this my last Will & Testament. *Allego* my will and
desire is that all my just debts be duly paid and discharged by my brother Henry
Tatum. *Item* I give & bequeath to my brother Henry Tatum all my lands left
me by my father last will & Testament and I give & bequeath to my brother
Henry Tatum all the remainder of my estate both real & personal with the
lands above mentioned to him and his heirs forever and lastly I constitute
my brother Henry Tatum my whole & sole Executor of this my last Will & Testament
In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this
twenty eighth day of April one thousand eight hundred & two
