Will

I Thomas Landie of the County of Brunswick and parish of St. Andrew, enjoying soundness of mind, sense and memory, make this my last Will & Testament, this eleventh day of April One Thousand Seven hundred & ninety seven in form & manner following (Wit) I give unto my son William Landie five hundred acres of land, being part of that tract bought of Henry Morris dec^d & including forty seven acres of land I exchanged with John Lloyd, the line to be run in such a direction between the Mill pond & back line as to make that tract & the residue as compact and convenient plantation as may be, to him and his heirs forever.

I give and bequeath to my son Alexander Ferguson Landie the remainder of that tract one acre excepted, purchased of Henry Morris and one hundred & 10 to run, bought of Lester Morris, the line to be run as before directed, to him & his heirs forever.

I give and bequeath unto my son David Greenway Landie two hundred and fifty acres of land, whereon my dwelling house and other improvements stand, the use thereof being however given to my Wife Lucy during her life or widowhood, likewise my Wife and one acre of land on the Northeast side thereof, together with all the land overflown by the pond, likewise give him twenty acres of land purchased of Henry Morris dec^d & bounded by the lands of Lewis Brown dec^d and William Pacey, & the old Courthouse road, the line dividing the tract I purchased of Drury Hitt, & the remainder thereof to be run in such a manner as to make both parts as convenient as may be to him and his heirs for ever.

I give and bequeath unto my son Thomas Yates Landie the remainder of my land bought of Drury Hitt, containing four hundred and sixty five acres, the line to be run as before directed, to him & his heirs for ever.

I leave unto my Wife Lucy Landie during her widowhood the use of my mansion house & the two hundred & fifty acres of land before given to my son David Greenway Landie, & likewise the use of the following negroes (Wit) Phoebe, George, & Hannah, serving the same period of time.
