Sarah Smith being in perfect strength of memory and believing that my time of residence here is not long declare this to be my last Will and Testament in the first place I commit my body to the earth and my soul to God who first gave it humbly trusting that in the great day of Judgment to be raised to enjoy the presence of God through the merits of my blessed Lord and saviour Jesus Christ as to my worldly goods I dispose and devise in the following manner in the first place I direct that all ^{my} just debts ^{shall} be paid by the sale of a piece of Land that I bought of John Dugger and my work Steers - I then give to my younger daughter Rebecca Abner my Chest of drawers and black walnut Table my Linn & slays & harness my spinning wheel also ^{all} my pots and coven also my corner cupboard with all the furniture belonging to the same also all my corn and Bacon. To my beloved daughter Polly Dugger I leave all her proportion of her Father's Estate that I bought of her during of her natural life if she hereafter has an heir or heirs it is my will that it should be then Equally divided between them but if she have no heir then it is to be Equally divided between the whole of my children and as much of my estate that I have not already given away it is my will that it should be divided equally among my children
