signs forever also her choice of three of our best feather beds
also after my Just debts are paid I lend unto my said
Wife all the residue of my Estate during her life to sup-
port & Educate my Children on, Except a Tract of Land
lying in Mecklinburg County in partnership between
Benjamin Williamson & myself, that I wish to be sold
for the payment of my Debts and at the death of my said Wife
that part of my estate lent her to be equally divided be-
tween my then surviving Children
And lastly I do constitute & appoint my friend John Camp
& John Blair as my Executors to this my last Will &
Testament recording all other Wills heretofore made
