In the name of God Amen I Frances Green of Brunswick County do make & ordain this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following that is to say after my Just debts and funeral expenses are paid It is my Will and desire that all my Estate of every kind whatsoever that doth not wast be kept together until my son Robert Green arrives to the age of Seventeen years for the purpose of Educating and supporting him untill that time and then to be equally divided between him the said Robert and my son Henry Green to them and their Heirs and Assigns forever & lastly I constitute & appoint my Brother Henry Brittonden Execu- tor of this my Will and Testament reboking all others here- before made as witness my hand & Seal this 16 day of Sept. 1796

the head of the said Branch a North Course to the line which
was formerly Richard Bagwells. I also leave to my said wife
during her natural life the use of the following Slaves To wit
great Robt. Frank, old Ned, Judy, Sall, Loris, & Hannah and at her decease
I give & Bequeath the said Slaves to my Sons John Flood Edmunds
James & William Sanning Edmunds to them their & Assigns forever
to be equally divided among them. Item I give & Bequeath
to my said wife Lucy my Negro Woman Faithly & her three Chil-
dren Duncan, Amos & Dilly my Cockie, Waggon, Blacksmiths
Tools, plantation, utensils my household stuff of all kinds as it
now stands all my Stock of horses Cattle, Sheep, Hogs, both at the
Plantation whereon I live & at my Quarter in the Occaneekey neck
in North Carolina to be disposed of as she thinks proper Item I give
and Bequeath to my Son John Flood Edmunds my tract of
