

In the name of God Amen I Thomas Penn of the
 County of Brunswick do hereby make and enact this my last Will and Testament
 in manner and form following Item I Give and bequeath unto Thomas Macless
 Pascal Penn and Thomas Penn and their heirs forever three negroes named
 Clara Calmons and Anting with their future increase and one fifth part of
 the rest and residue of my estate or a proportion of either of my childrens estate should
 any die under age and unmarried in trust for the use of my Daughter Nancy Kelly
 for & during the term of her natural life or coverture with her present husband
 and at her death in case her said husband should survive her, then the said estate
 to be equally divided amongst the issue of her body of any but in default of such
 issue then to be equally divided amongst my few other children or the survivors
 of them but no part she should receive hereunder but as my desire is
 that the said trustee or the survivors or survivors of them convey the estate hereby
 vested in them in fee simple to my said Daughter Nancy and her heirs forever
 and I desire that the said trustee but my Daughter Nancy in possession of
 the estate be and vested in them her and during the term of her natural life
 provided they suffer no part thereof to be sold hired out or carried out of the
 County. Item I Give unto my son Pascal Penn and his heirs forever one Horse
 Bridle & Saddle all my carpenter & Joiners tools and three negroes namely Joseph
 Powell & Hope with their future increase to him and his heirs forever -
 Item I Give unto my son Thomas Penn three negroes namely Peter, Henry and
 Allen with their future increase one Horse Bridle & Saddle to him and his heirs
 forever. Item I Give unto my Daughter Cathery Penn four negroes namely James
 Griffin, Loring & Nicholas with their future increase and one feather Bed and
 furniture to her and her heirs forever Item I Give and bequeath unto my Daughter
 Catherine Penn four negroes namely Ag, Dick, Mary & Myrno with their future
 increase to her and her heirs forever. Item the rest and residue of my estate
 of all kinds I Give unto my beloved wife Elizabeth during her natural life or
 widowhood and at her death or marriage I leave the land and plantations to be
 equally divided between my sons Pascal and Thomas Penn and all the rest and residue
 of my estate to be equally divided between my sons Pascal Penn, Thomas Penn the
 trustees for my Daughter Nancy Kelly and my Daughter Cathery Catherine
 to them and their heirs forever Lastly I do hereby appoint my son Pascal
 Penn and Thomas Penn Executors of this my last Will and Testament as
 Witness my hand and seal this 17th day of August 1810
