In the Name of God Amen I Thomas Sadler Sen^r of the County of Brunswick do make this my last Will & Testament in manner and form following (to wit) I lend unto my wife Rebecca Sadler two Beds & furniture during her life And at her death I give the said two Beds to my two grand Sons John & Henry Sadler, to John I give the one I sleep on & the other to Henry to them & their Heirs forever I Give unto my Son Henry Sadler six Shillings to him and his

Thus far I Give unto my two Daughters Fanny Duggar &
 Elizabeth Bonnet one Bed & Bedstead to be equally Divided
 between them & their Heirs forever. I Give unto my Son Fea-
 therstone Sadler to him & his Heirs forever the tract of Land
 wherein I now live by estimation two Hundred & sixty one acres
 more or less. Provided he pays my Son Charles Sadler thirty
 five pounds. And in case my Son Featherstone does not pay unto
 my Son Charles the above thirty five pounds Then I Give unto
 my said Son Charles Sadler one Hundred acres of Land to be
 taken off the South side of the said tract of Land & between
 the Gum branch & the Road to him & his Heirs forever.
