whole of the balance of my Estate I give to my son Radford Gunn to him & his
heirs forever I appoint Samuel Moseley John Horns & Peter Read Executors of this
my last will and Testament Disallowing and Disannulling all other wills or testies

 live to be equally divided between them on the death of Dearly beloved wife
 Seller. Item I leave unto my Dearly beloved wife during her life the Tract
 of land given as above to my two sons. Item I leave unto my Dearly
 beloved wife wife Seller during her life all the rest of my estate and at her
 death it is my will and desire that it be equally divided among my then
 surviving children. Item it is my will & desire that if either of my
 children should loose the Negro I have given him before he shall get the
 Age of 21st my Executors shall make good the
 loss of the Negro to his said child at the death of my wife Seller out of
